THREE HALIFAX REGIONAL NURSES NAMED TO GREAT 100 LIST Tradition of Excellence Continues

They are Cynthia J. Eaton, a staff nurse at the Birthing Center, Debbie Sanders, director of education, and Karen Daniels, vice president of nursing.

They bring to 11 the number of Registered Nurses at Halifax Regional to be named a Great 100 Nurse, eight of those since 2007.

The Great 100 was founded in 1988 when Heather Thorne, RN, called together fellow Registered Nurses to develop a plan to recognize outstanding nurses in the State.
