and it surpasses some of the labs in larger hospitals."

Services offered at the Cardiac & Vascular Center include:

- Diagnosis and treatment of Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD). We open up blockages and increase blood flow to arms and legs, preventing possible amputation.
- Cardiac catheterization a test to determine blood flow for blockages and blood pressure in the chambers of the heart.
- Installation of pacemakers to ensure appropriate rhythm of the heart.

If you've experienced pain in your chest or legs, particularly following any type of exertion, the cause could be constricting blood vessels due to an accumulation of plaque. See your primary care physician or cardiologist for diagnosis and treatment.

"We have been associated with Raleigh Cardiology for more than 20 years, and the physicians there know many of our patients," says Isaac Miller, MD, an internal medicine specialist at Halifax Medical Specialists. "There is an excellent connection with Raleigh Cardiology to handle complications and emergencies." "I recommend patients use the services of the Cardiac and Vascular Center," says Somasekhara Balla, MD, a cardiologist also with Halifax Medical Specialists. "Patients do not have to travel long distances away from home and family."

"The cardiac services at Halifax Regional are very good and meet the needs of the community," Dr. Balla added.

"Patients benefit by not having to travel long distances for diagnostic procedures," says Natarajan Manickam, MD, FACP, also a cardiologist with Halifax Medical Specialists. "I recommend the tests for patients who need the procedure to find out whether they have any blockages to the heart artery. We have a good relationship with Raleigh Cardiology and very good cardiac services available here with a good support system."

These procedures are performed on an outpatient basis, allowing patients to be home the same day. "Previously, patients were required to go out of town for these advanced procedures," said Mahone. "Now, patients in our region benefit from the convenience of Halifax Regional and our outstanding quality of care."

Indicators of PAD.

Peripheral Artery Disease (PAD) is a common circulation problem in which arteries carrying blood to the legs are not functioning well or become narrowed or clogged due to a build-up of plaque. Here are some questions to help you determine if you may be at risk or have symptoms of PAD.

- 1. Have you ever been diagnosed as having poor circulation?
- 2. Have you ever had surgery, balloon procedures or stents in your heart, kidneys, belly, legs or arms?
- 3. When you walk, do you experience aching, cramping or pain in your arms, legs, thighs or buttocks?
- 4. Do your feet or toes bother you most nights while lying in bed, with relief when they are dangled at the edge of the bed?
- 5. Do you have any painful sores or ulcers on legs or feet that do not heal?
- 6. Are your legs or arms pale, discolored or bluish?
